


Students' View on College Administrator/principal:


Students Views on College Office:

The following chart displays the students' views on the performance of the college office in various aspects like Regularity, Accessibility, Supportiveness, Compatibility, and Technicality.




Students' Feedback Regarding College Library:


Students' Feedback Regarding Syllabus Coverage:


Student Feedback Regarding Uses of ICT by Teachers in Classroom


<u>Student Feedback Regarding Multiple Opportunities of Learning Provided by the</u> Institution



A Report on Career counseling and NEP implementation



Report on One-Day Workshop on Organic Farming

Date: December 08/09/2023

On September 8, 2023, IQAC, B.H.B. The workshop started promptly at 11:00 AM with an opening address by Dr. Dipti Kalita, HoD of Political Science, who emphasized the importance of organic farming in today's world. She explained how sustainable agricultural practices can help preserve soil health, reduce chemical dependency, and produce healthier food. The event attracted over 60 participants, including a mix of students, faculty, and local farmers from nearby villages.

Session Overview:




