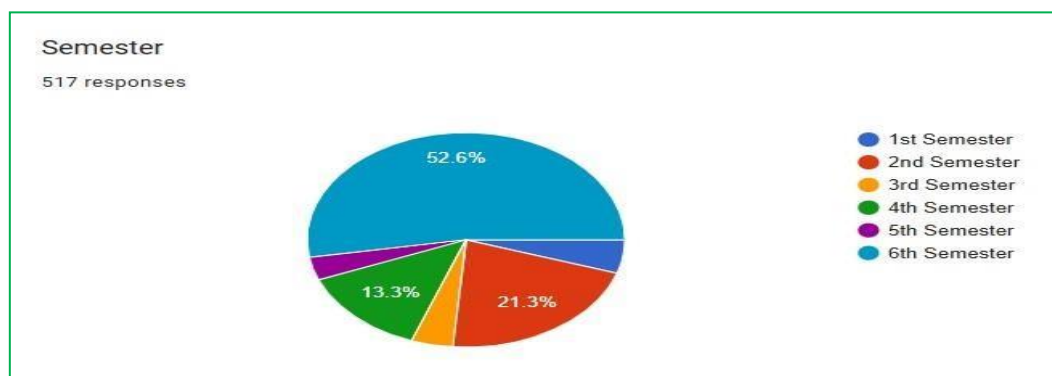

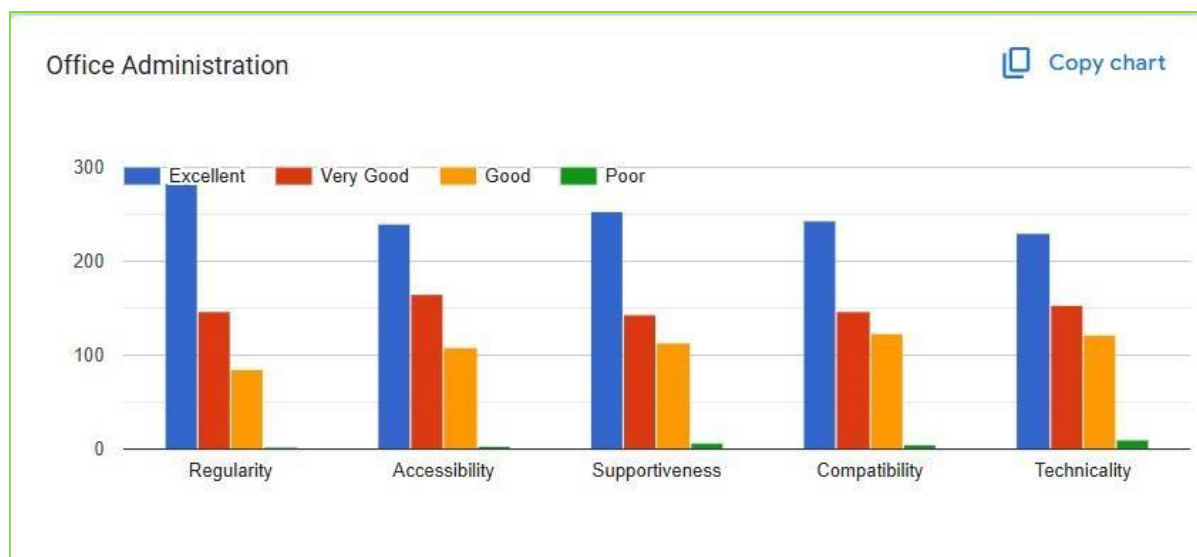
Data Collection and Analysis:

An effort was made to receive feedback from all the college students. Out of a total of 527 students of B.H. B. College, Sarupeta, 519 students recorded their responses through the online feedback form provided to them by the college authority.



Students' View on College Administrator/principal:

So far as the regularity of the administrator/ principal is concerned, more than 300 students marked him as an excellent administrator, almost 140 as very good, and nearly 50 students as Good. In the case of accessibility, 250 students ticked the excellent button, more than 150 students were very good, and 75 students were good. Regarding supportiveness, 275 students marked him as excellent, 150 students were very good, and 95 students were good.



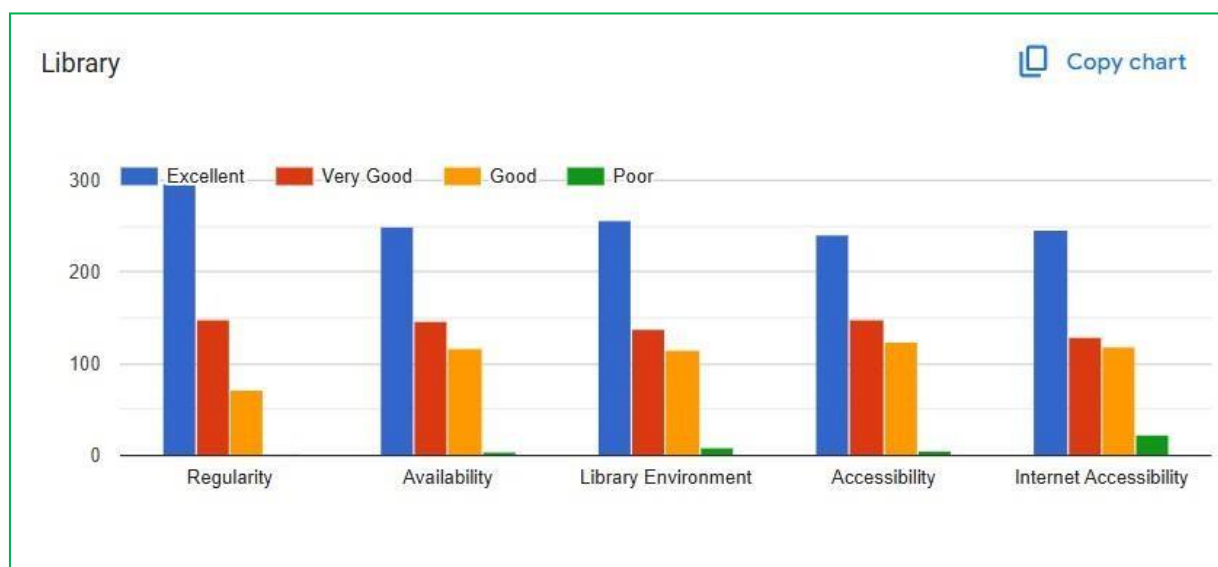
Students Views on College Office:

The following chart displays the students' views on the performance of the college office in various aspects like Regularity, Accessibility, Supportiveness, Compatibility, and Technicality.



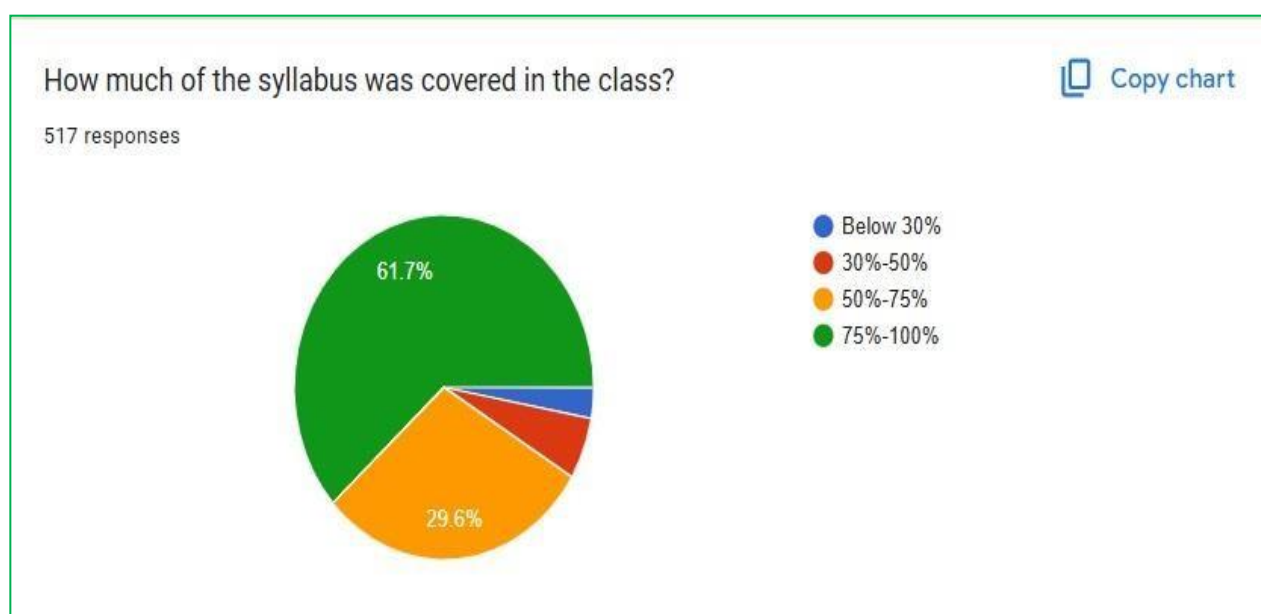
Students' Feedback Regarding College Library:

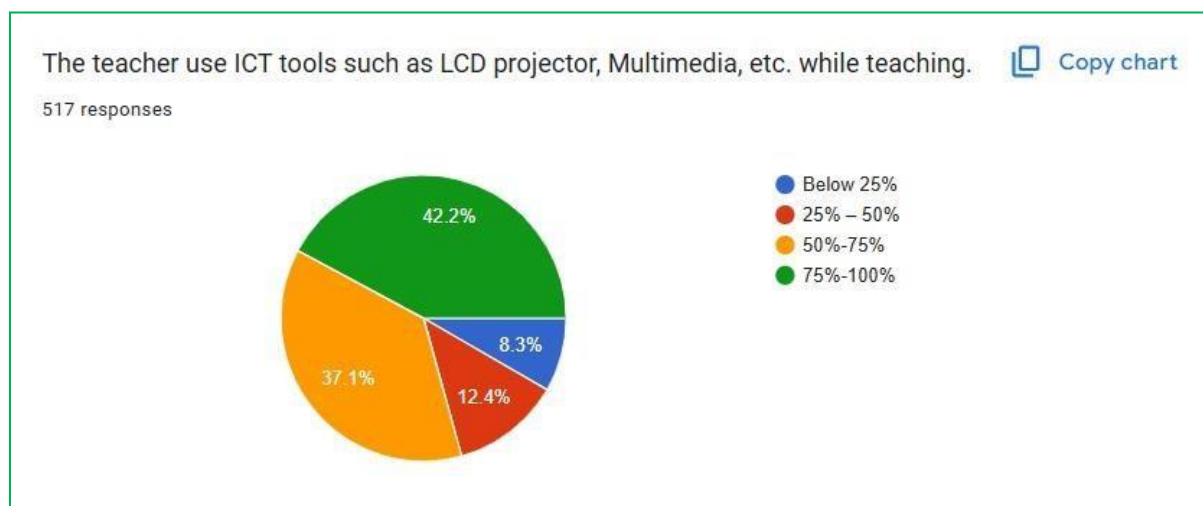
Students' Feedback Regarding Syllabus Coverage:

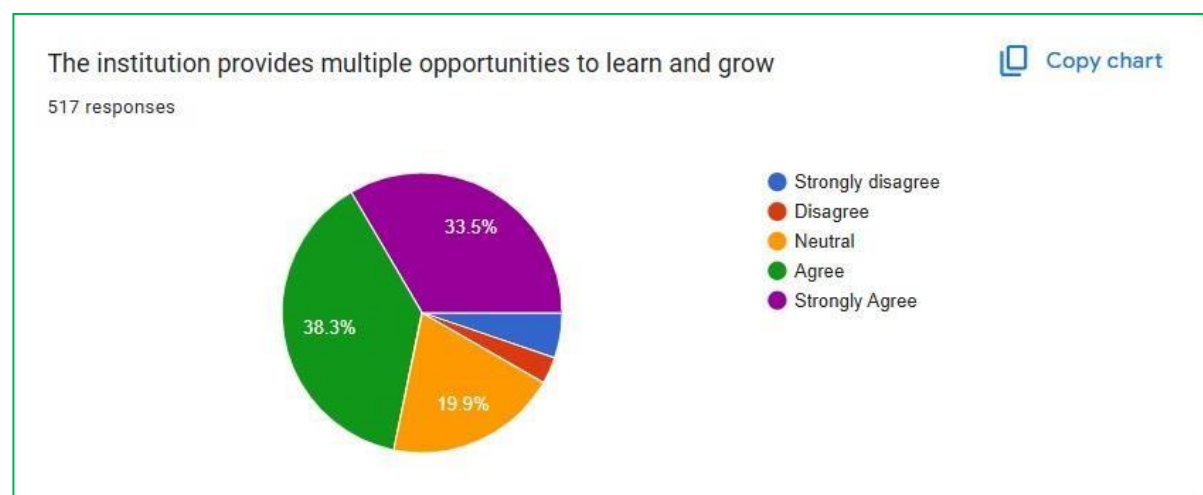
Student Feedback Regarding Uses of ICT by Teachers in Classroom

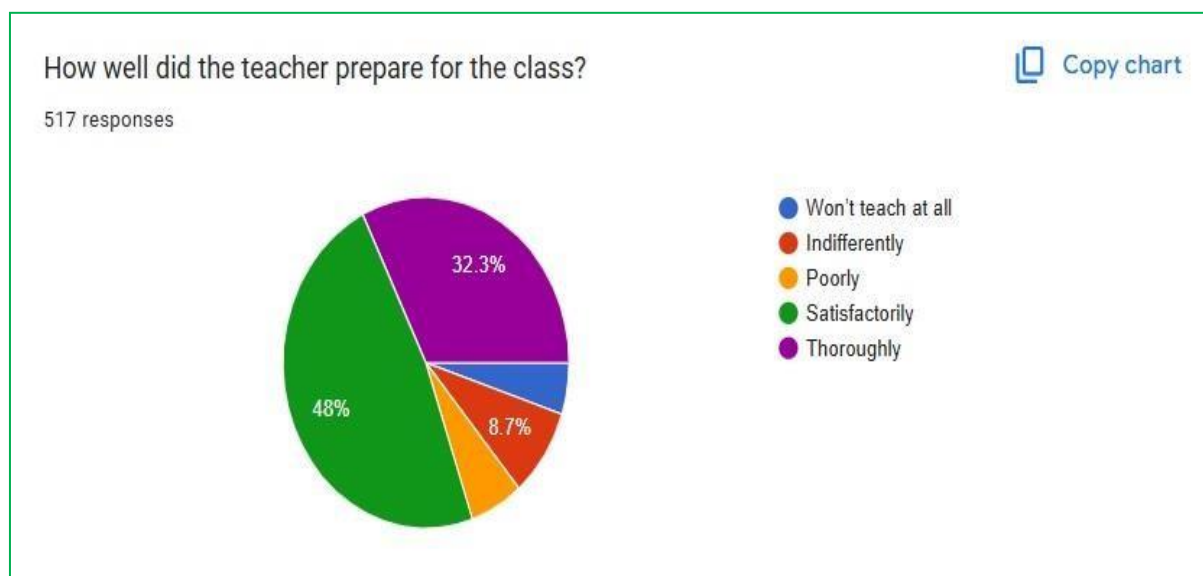
Student Feedback Regarding Multiple Opportunities of Learning Provided by the Institution

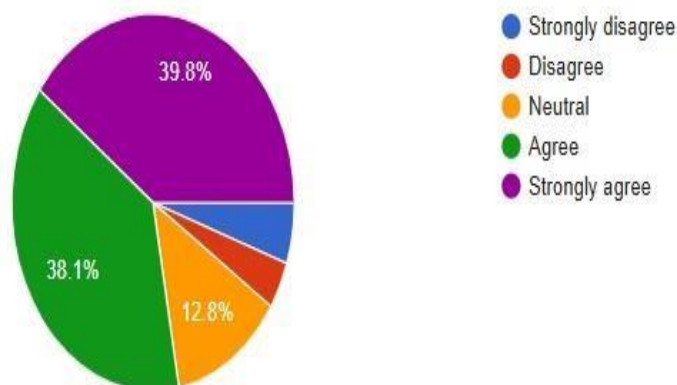
Students' Feedback Regarding Teachers' Involvement in the Class

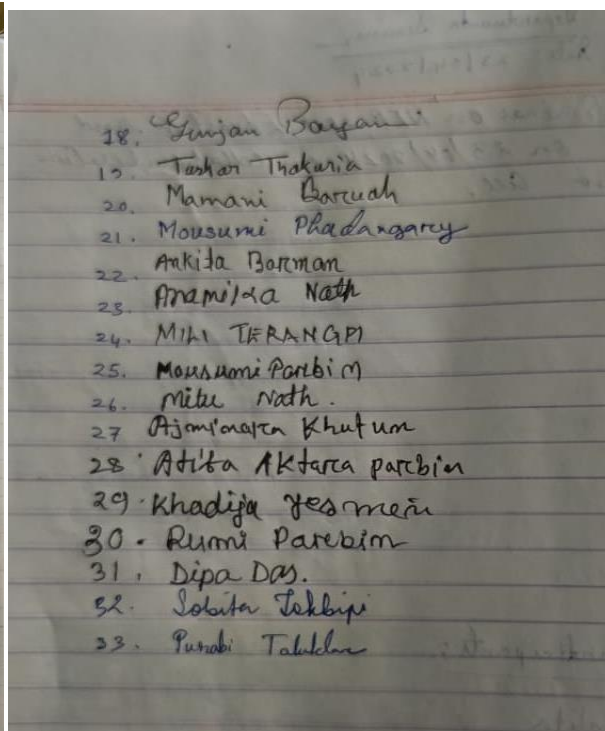
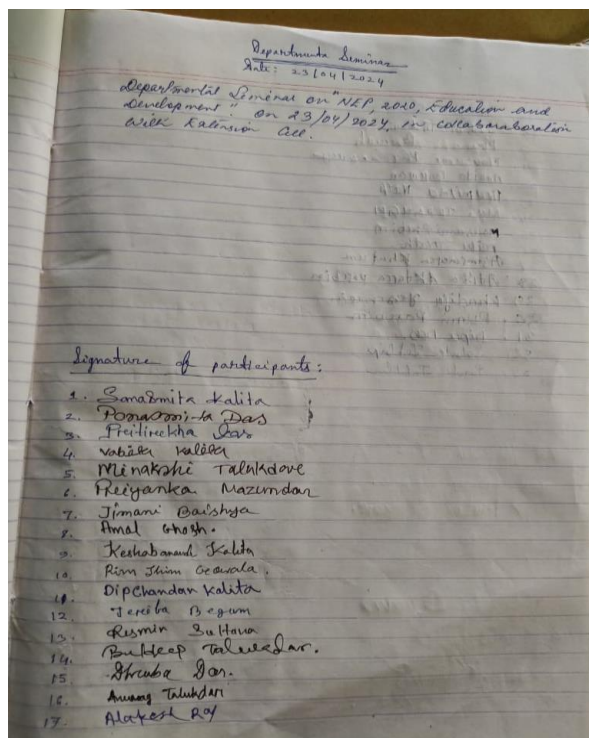


Departmental Seminar

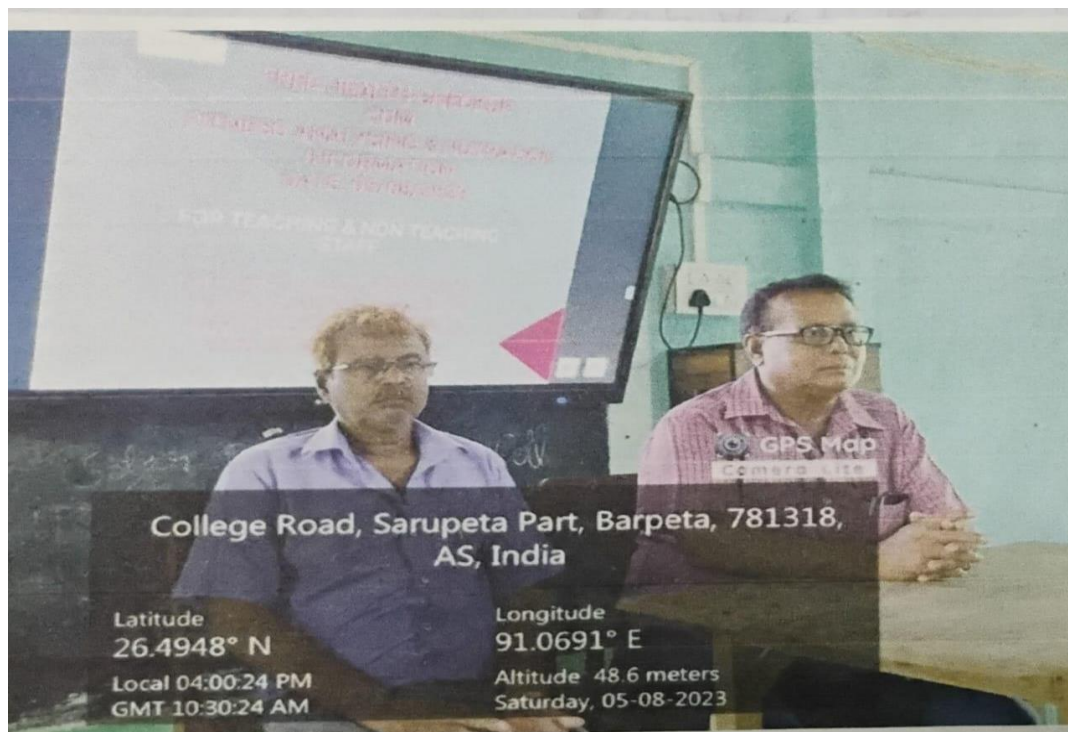

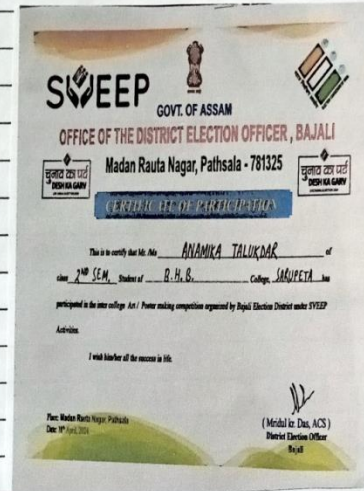

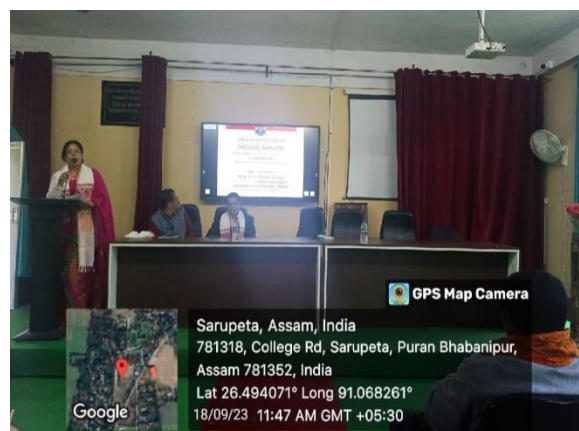
Session Overview:

He explained that the success of AI largely depends on proper timing and techniques, such as detecting estrus in cows and using the correct handling and storage methods for semen. Furthermore, the lecture covered the role of **extension services and government schemes** that promote the adoption of AI among farmers. Dr. Baishya encouraged the participants to utilize these resources to improve their farming practices and increase their economic returns. The lecture was interactive, with Dr. Baishya answering several questions from the audience, addressing concerns related to AI's practical challenges, and providing valuable insights on improving cattle farming techniques. His extensive knowledge and experience were appreciated by all attendees.

In conclusion, the session provided a comprehensive understanding of cattle farming and the critical role of Artificial Insemination in modernizing livestock production. 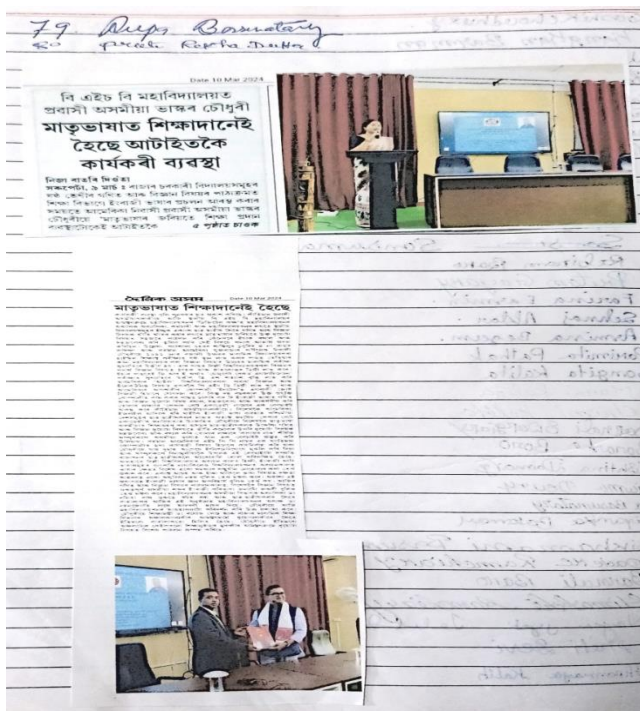
