Admission Procedure:

- Application form with prospectus for admission into the college will be issued by the college office on payment of Rs. 150.00 (Rupees One hundred fifty) only.
- B) Students are selected for admission into the college on the basis of their academic record.

- (c) A Certificate of Inspiration, an "Aronai" to each student securing First Class in Bodo (Major) in the B.A. Final Examination.
- (d) A Certificate of Inspiration, an "Aronal" to each student securing Letter Marks in Bodo (MIL) and Advance Bodo in the H.S. Final Examination.

Library:

The college library has a good collection of books (both text and reference) on various subjects to meet the needs of the students as well as the teachers. Daily Newspaper and selected journals are also regularly subscribed. The library has been computerized. The reading room of the library provides ample facilities for reading to a large number of students as well as teachers. Reprographic facilities are also available in the library.

Working hours: 9:30 A.M. to 4:30 P.M. on all working days.

Rules for the Library:

- (i) The students are provided with Borrower Cards. These cards are strictly non-transferable. The cards must be surrendered at the end of the academic session.
- (ii) One Borrower Card is issued to each student of H.S. Class / TDC General Course and he / she can borrow one book at a time. Two Borrower cards are issued to each student of Major Course and he /she can borrow two books at a time.
- (iii) No student is allowed to keep a book for more that 10 days in any case. A fine of Rs. 50/-(Rupees Fifty) only will be imposed for each day for book / books retained beyond the specified time. However, borrowed book / books, if returned before the expiry of the specified date, may be re-issued for a period of another 10 days.
- (iv) Any book lost, or damaged must be replaced by the borrower. If the book is one of a series and can not be obtained singly, the whole set must be replaced by the borrower.

Book Bank:

The college has a Book Bank for helping the poor students with necessary text and reference books.

College Uniform:

It is compulsory for the students of the college to wear uniform as prescribed below.

(a) For Boys: Shirt and Trousers

Shirt : Blush Pink
Trouser : Black

Blazer/Pullover : Maroon

(b) For Girls : Shalwar-Kameez and Dupatta

Shalwar : Black

Kameez : Blush Pink

(Long, loose fit and with sleeves)

Dupatta: Black

Blazer/Pullover: Maroon

In addition to the prescribed uniform, students may be allowed to wear traditional dresses in conformity with the colour of the prescribed uniform mentioned above. However, decency in respect of dresses should strictly be maintained.

Anti Ragging Measures

In pursuance to the judgment of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India dated 08 - 05 - 2009 in Civil Appeal No. 887/2009, the UGC framed "UGC Regulations on curbing the menace of ragging in higher educational institutions, 2009" which were notified on 17th June 2009 and are to be mandatorily followed by all universities and colleges. The Regulations are available on the UGC website, i.e. www.ugc.ac.in.

Examination:

The college holds both external and internal examination, the details of which are as follows:

(A) External Examinations:

The college is recognized as Examination Centres of both Gauhati University (G.U.) and Assam Higher Secondary Education Council (AHSEC).

All the examinations of the TDC Course of G.U. are conducted in the college Centre by a committee constituted in conformity with rules and regulations of G.U.

The H.S. 1st Year (Annual) and 2nd Year (Final) examinations of AHSEC are also conducted by a committee constituted as per rules and regulations of AHSEC.

(B) Internal Examinations:

The college holds internal examinations such as Test / Terminal / Sessional etc. There is a separate committee to conduct these examinations.



(Approved in the meeting of the Academic Council) Regulation of TOC for Semester System & with Choice based Credit and Grading System.

- 1. A TOC shall be of Six Semesters covering three Calendar Year. The schedule for Semester system shall be as shown below:
 - (a) First, Third and Ffth Semester: August 1-Dec-31 (including examinations)
 - (b) Second, Fourth and Sixth Semester: January 1-June -30 (including examinations)
 - (c) Semester Break: July 1- July 31.

The Academic Calendar and schedule for Semester System is given in Annexure-I.

2. Student's performance should be monitored through out the Semester by continuous assessment in the theory and practical courses. Evaluation of the Students performance in each of the theory and practical paper will be based on the following : Internal Evaluation: 20% Marks

External Evaluation: 80% Marks

- Internal Evaluation should be based on two sessional examinations, home assignments, Seminars, and library work in each Semester. The schedule for internal evaluation is given in Annexure-II. The procedure for internal evaluation is given in Annexure-III.
- External Evaluation should be through a final examination at the end on the Semester. The procedure for external evaluation is given in Annexure-IV.
- The pass marks in each theory paper is 30 % and that in each practical paper is 40%. 5
- In each paper, students must secure pass marks in both the internal as well as the external evaluation










