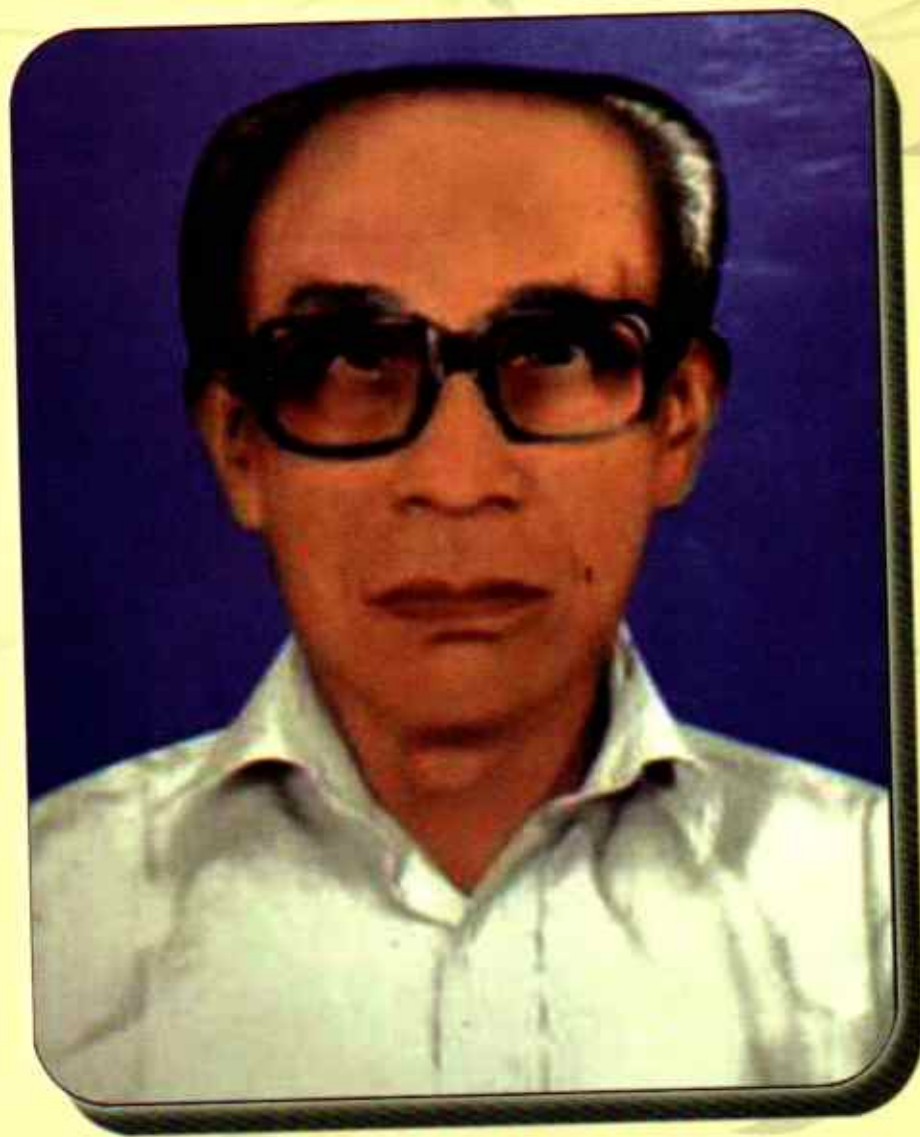

Admission Procedure :

A) Application forms with prospectus for admission to the college will be issued by the college office on payment of Rs. 200.00 (Rupees Two hundred) only.

B) Students are selected for admission to the college on the basis of their academic records.

C) There is reservation of seats for students belonging to ST/SC/OBC/MOBC as per Government rules.

D) Students are required to produce original copies of the following documents at the time of admission.

- a. Marksheet of the last qualifying examination.
- b. Age Certificate (H.S.L.C. pass certificate / admit card etc.)
- c. Character certificate from the Head of the institution last attended.
- d. Caste certificate where necessary.
- e. One copy of passport size photograph
- f. Two stamp size photographs for identity card.

E) A student failing to get admitted in the same year of passing will have to submit a gap certificate from the Head of the institution attended last stating the cause / causes for gap to the satisfaction of the Principal.

F) The college authority reserves the right to reject an application for admission without assigning any reason for the same.



Hostel facilities for Girls :

B. H. B. College has a Women's Hostel, constructed with the U.G.C. Grants. It has been functioning effectively since its inception in 2014. The hostel can accommodate 44 boarders in maximum.

- (a) A cash Prize of Rs. 500/- (Five hundred) only, an Aronai and Thulungayari Man Bilai to the student who secures the highest mark in Bodo (Major) in B.A. Final Examination.
- (b) A cash prize of Rs. 500/- (Five hundred) only, an Aronai and "Certificate of Inspiration" to the student who secures the highest mark in Bodo (MIL) and Advance Bodo in H.S. Final Examination.
- (c) A Certificate of Inspiration, An "Aronai" to each student securing First Class in Bodo (Major) in the B.A. Final Examination.
- (d) A Certificate of Inspiration, an "Aronai" to each student securing Letter Marks in Bodo (MIL) and Advance Bodo in the H.S. Final Examination.

Library :-

The college library has a good collection of books (both text and reference) on various subjects to meet the needs of the students as well as as the teachers. Daily Newspapers and selected journals are also regularly subscribed. The library has been computerized. The reading room of the library provides ample facilities for reading to a large number of students as well as teachers. Reprographic facilities are also available in the library.

Working hours : 9:30 A.M. to 4:30 P.M. on all working days.

Rules for the Library :

- (i) The students are provided with Membership Cards without charging any fee. These cards are strictly non-transferable. The cards must be surrendered at the end of the academic session.
- (ii) One Membership Card is issued to each student of H.S. Class / TDC General Course and they can borrow one book at a time. Two Membership cards are issued to each student of Major Course and they can borrow two books at a time.
- (iii) No student is allowed to keep a book for more that 10 days in any case. A fine of Rs. 50/- (Rupees Fifty) only will be imposed for each day for each book retained beyond the specified time. However, borrowed book / books, if returned before the expiry of the specified date, may be re-issued for a period of another 10 days.
- (iv) Any book lost, or damaged must be replaced by the borrower. If the book is one of a series and cannot be obtained singly, the whole set must be replaced by the borrower.

Book Bank :

The college has a Book Bank for helping the poor students with necessary texts and reference books.

College Uniform :

The Uniform Dress Code of B. H. B. College is mentioned below. It is mandatory for all the students to follow the Uniform Dress Code while remaining present in the college campus on any occasion, or representing the college in any outside event.

The students are, of course, allowed to wear their own ethnic dresses in conformity with the colours of the prescribed Uniform Dress Code as stated above. However, decency in respect of dresses must strictly be maintained. Moreover, any dress that may assault the sentiments of any ethnic, religious or linguistic group is strictly prohibited.

Any change in the Uniform Dress Code may be initiated by the College authority after consultation with the Students' Union.

Anti-ragging measures :

B. H. B. College, Sarupeta strictly follows the guidelines prescribed by the "UGC Regulations for Curbing the Menace of Ragging in the Higher Educational Institutions, 2009" and its subsequent amendments. According to the UGC Regulations and its 3rd Amendment in 2016, Ragging constitutes one or more of the following acts:

- (a) any conduct by any student or students whether by words spoken or written or by any act which has the effect of teasing, treating or handling with rudeness a fresher or any other student;
- (b) indulging in rowdy or indisciplined activities by any student or students which causes or is likely to cause annoyance, hardship, physical or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof in any fresher or any other student;
- (c) asking any student to do any act which such student will not in the ordinary course do and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame, or torment or embarrassment so as to adversely affect the physis or psyche or such fresher or any other student;
- (d) any act by the senior student that prevents, disrupts and disturbs the regular academic activity of any other student or a fresher;
- (e) exploiting the services of a fresher or any other student for completing the academic tasks assigned to an individual or a group of students;
- (f) any act of financial extortion or forceful expenditure burden put on a fresher or any other student by students;
- (g) any act of physical abuse including all variants of it: sexual abuse, homosexual assaults, stripping, forcing obscene and lewd acts, gestures, causing bodily harm or any other danger to health or person;
- (h) any act of abuse by spoken words, emails, post, public insult which would also include deriving perverted pleasure, vicarious or sadistic thrill from actively or passively participating in the discomfiture to fresher or any other student;



(i) any act that affects the mental health and self-confidence of a fresher or any other student with or without the intent to derive a sadistic pleasure or showing off power, authority or superiority by a student over any fresher or any other student;

(j) any act of physical or mental abuse (including bullying and exclusion) targeted at another student (fresher or otherwise) on the ground of colour, race, religion, caste, ethnicity, gender (including transgender), sexual orientation, appearance, nationality, regional origins, linguistic identity, place of birth, place of residence or economic background.

The College has an Anti-Ragging Committee and an Anti-Ragging Squad constituted as per the above mentioned Regulations.

The U.G.C. Regulations state that the following actions may be initiated against a student or students found to be guilty in indulging in ragging as defined above.

- (a) Suspension from attending classes and academic privileges
- (b) Withholding/Withdrawing scholarship/fellowship and other benefits
- (c) Debarring from appearing in any test/examination or other evaluation process
- (d) Withholding results
- (e) Debarring from representing the institution in any regional, national or international meet, tournament, youth festival etc.
- (f) Suspension/expulsion from the hostel
- (g) Cancellation of admission
- (h) Rustication from the institution for a period ranging from one to four semesters.
- (i) Expulsion from the institution and consequent debarring from admission to any other institution for a specified period.

Provided that where the persons committing or abetting the act of ragging are not identified, the institution shall resort to collective punishment.

Examination :

The college holds both external and internal examinations the details of which are as follows:

(A) External Examinations :

The college is recognized as Examination Centres of both Gauhati University (G.U.) and Assam Higher Secondary Education Council (AHSEC).

All the examinations of the TDC Courses of G.U. are conducted in the college Centre by a committee constituted in conformity with the rules and regulations of G.U.

The H.S. 1st Year (Annual) and 2nd Year (Final) examinations of AHSEC are also conducted by a committee constituted as per rules and regulations of AHSEC.

(B) Internal Examinations :

The college holds internal examinations such as Test / Terminal / Sessional etc. There is a separate committee to conduct these examinations.



Collegiate Student Grievance Redressal Committee

The College has constituted a Collegiate Student Grievance Redressal Committee as per the guidelines prescribed in "University Grants Commission (Redress of Grievances of Students) Regulations 2019".

Internal Complaints Committee

As per the provisions laid down in "Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace (Prevention, Prohibition and Redressal) Act, 2013" and "University Grants Commission (Prevention, prohibition and redressal of sexual harassment of women employees and students in higher educational institutions Regulations, 2015", B. H. B. College has constituted an Internal Complaints Committee to deal with matters of sexual harassment of women at the college.

Regulation of TOC for Semester System
& with Choice based Credit and Grading System.

1. A TOC shall be of Six Semesters covering three Calendar Year. The schedule for Semester system shall be as shown below:
(a) First, Third and Fifth Semester: August 1-Dec-31 (including examinations)
(b) Second, Fourth and Sixth Semester : January 1-June -30 (including examinations)
(c) Semester Break: July 1- July 31.
The Academic Calendar and schedule for Semester System is given in Annexure-I.
Course Structure under Semester System given in Annexure-II.
2. Student's performance should be monitored through out the Semester by continuous assessment in the theory and practical courses. Evaluation of the Students performance in each of the theory and practical paper will be based on the following :
Internal Evaluation : 20% Marks
External Evaluation : 80% Marks
3. Internal Evaluation should be based on two sessional examinations, home assignments, Seminars, and library work in each Semester. The schedule for internal evaluation is given in Annexure-I. The procedure for internal evaluation is given in Annexure-III.
4. External Evaluation should be through a final examination at the end on the Semester. The procedure for external evaluation is given in Annexure-IV.
5. The pass marks in each theory paper is 30 % and that in each practical paper is 40%.
6. In each paper, students must secure pass marks in both the internal as well as the external evaluation

Some Important Points of Under Graduate Choice Based Credit System of Gauhati University

1. The academic work in each semester will require the student to engage with chosen courses, the content of which will be described in detail in the syllabi. Every course will have defined learning objectives and may be designed to comprise lectures, tutorials, laboratory work, field work, project work or any other activity that addresses the learning objectives of the course.

2. Each course will have credits, assigned on the basis of course related activities, which a student will earn through satisfactory fulfillment of the academic requirement of the course.

3. An undergraduate degree program with Honours in a discipline will have a course credit requirement of 148 credits while an undergraduate degree program without Honours will require a student to earn 132 course credits. Students in a Honours program can opt to earn additional credits by undertaking additional Elective courses subject to the condition that the total number of course credits does not exceed 160 credits. For a student in a Regular program, this credit ceiling will be 140 credits. The credits earned beyond the mandatory program requirement will not be taken into consideration in computation of the student's grade but will be recorded in the grade sheet.

4. The medium of instruction and examination will be English and/or Assamese, except in language courses.

NATURE AND NOMENCLATURE OF COURSES:

(i) In line with the UGC's guidelines, the courses are categorized as Core courses, Elective courses or Ability Enhancement courses

(ii) Core Course. A Core course is a course that has to be compulsorily studied. A student in an undergraduate degree programme with Honours will have to take up 14 core courses, each of 6 credits. In a Regular undergraduate degree programme a student will need to take up 12 core courses, each again of 6 credits.

(iii) Elective Course: An Elective course is to be chosen by the student from a pool of such courses on offer and will essentially be of three types:

(a) **Discipline Specific Elective Course:** An Elective Course which is offered by the main discipline. The discipline offering a Discipline Specific Elective course may also offer discipline related elective courses that are interdisciplinary in nature. A student enrolled in an undergraduate degree program with Honours will have to earn 24 course credits from Discipline Specific Elective courses. For a student enrolled in a non-Honours undergraduate degree program in science, the course credit requirement from Discipline Specific Elective courses will be 36 credits. For a student enrolled in a non-Honours undergraduate degree program in Arts and Commerce, the course credit requirement from Discipline Specific Elective courses will be 24 credits.



(b) **Generic Elective Course:** A Generic Elective Course is offered by an unrelated discipline and has the objective of broadening the academic experience of a student. A student enrolled in an undergraduate degree program with Honours can acquire 24 course credits from Generic Elective Courses. A Core Course offered in a discipline may be allowed as an Elective to a student from another discipline. This course will be treated under the category of Generic Elective Courses. Generic Elective Courses are not available to students in a non-Honours undergraduate science degree program while other non-Honours undergraduate programmes require enrollees to take up two such courses.

(c) **Dissertation/Project:** Engaging students in a Project/ Dissertation work, which requires knowledge application and problem solving, is considered to be important in the learning process. All students enrolled in an undergraduate degree program (Honours and non-Honours) will have the option of choosing to undertake Project/Dissertation work for 6 credits in lieu of a 6 credit Discipline Specific Elective course in the fifth semester only.

(iv) **Ability Enhancement Courses:** Ability Enhancement Courses which are to be taken up by students in an undergraduate degree program will be of two types:

(a) **Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses:** These 4 credit courses are mandatory for every student enrolled in an undergraduate degree program. A student will have to take up 4 credit course in Environmental Science and a second 4 credit course in English Communication/ MIL Communication.

(b) **Skill Enhancement Courses:** Skill Enhancement Courses will be valuebased or skill based and there will be a pool of courses on offer. A student enrolled in an undergraduate degree program with Honours will have to take up a minimum of two SEC courses of 4 credits each as part of the program requirement. For students enrolled in non-Honours undergraduate degree programs the credit requirement from Skill Enhancement Courses will be 16 credits. It is desirable that the university will prepare Skill Enhancement Courses for various disciplines from the list of SEC provided by the UGC template. However colleges are free to develop their own SECs independently which must have prior approval of the Academic Council.
