

It is compulsory for a student to study minimum three subjects from the above-mentioned list of elective subjects. However, a student may take up one more subject from the same list as an additional elective subject.

Details of the Three-year Degree Course

The B.A. Courses follow the CBCS system.

<u>Some Important Points of Under Graduate Choice Based Credit System of Gauhati University</u>

- 1) The academic work in each semester will require the student to engage with chosen courses, the content of which will be described in detail in the syllabi. Every course will have defined learning objectives and may be designed to comprise lectures, tutorials, laboratory work, field work, project work or any other activity that addresses the learning objectives of the course.
- 2) Each course will have credits, assigned on the basis of course related activities, which a

- student will earn through satisfactory fulfilment of the academic requirement of the course as per the Affiliating University. .
- 3) An undergraduate degree programme with Honours in a discipline will have a course credit requirement of 148 credits while an undergraduate degree program without Honours will require a student to earn 132 course credits. Students in an Honours programme can opt to earn additional credits by undertaking additional Elective courses subject to the condition that the total number of course credits does not exceed 160 credits. For a student in a Regular programme, this credit ceiling will be 140 credits. The credits earned beyond the mandatory programme requirement will not be taken into consideration in computation of the student's grade but will be recorded in the grade sheet.
- 4) The medium of instruction and examination will be held in English and/or Assamese, except in language courses.

Nature and Nomenclature of Courses

- 1) In line with the UGC's guidelines, the courses are categorized as Core courses, Elective courses or Ability Enhancement courses
- 2) **Core Course:** A Core course is a course that has to be compulsorily studied. A student in an undergraduate degree programme with Honours will have to take up 14 core courses, each of 6 credits. In a Regular undergraduate degree programme a student will need to take up 12 core courses, each again of 6 credits.
- 3) **Elective Course:** An Elective course is to be chosen by the student from a pool of such courses on offer and will essentially be of three types:
- a) Discipline Specific Elective Course: An Elective Course which is offered by the main discipline. The discipline offering a Discipline Specific Elective course may also offer discipline related elective courses that are interdisciplinary in nature. A student enrolled in an undergraduate degree programme with Honours will have to earn 24 course credits from Discipline Specific Elective courses. For a student enrolled in a non-Honours undergraduate degree programme in science, the course credit requirement from Discipline Specific Elective courses will be 36 credits. For a student enrolled in a non-Honours undergraduate degree programme in Arts and Commerce, the course credit requirement from Discipline Specific Elective courses will be 24 credits.
- b) Generic Elective Course: A Generic Elective Course is offered by an unrelated discipline and has the objective of broadening the academic experience of a student. A student enrolled in an undergraduate degree programme with Honours can acquire 24 course credits from Generic Elective Courses. A Core Course offered in a discipline may be allowed as an Elective to a student from another discipline. This course will be treated under the category of Generic Elective Courses. Generic Elective Courses are not available to students in a non-Honours

- undergraduate science degree programme while other non- Honours undergraduate programmes require enrollees to take up two such courses.
- c) **Dissertation/Project:** Engaging students in a Project/ Dissertation work, which requires knowledge application and problem solving, is considered to be important in the learning process. All students enrolled in an undergraduate degree program (Honours and non-Honours) will have the option of choosing to undertake Project/Dissertation work for 6 credits in lieu of a 6 credit Discipline Specific Elective course in the fifth semester only.
- **4. Ability Enhancement Courses:** Ability Enhancement Courses which are to be taken up by students in an undergraduate degree programme will be of two types:
- a). **Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses:** These 4 credit courses are mandatory for every student enrolled in an undergraduate degree programme. A student will have to take up 4 credit course in Environmental Science and a second 4 credit course in English Communication/ MIL Communication.
- b) **Skill Enhancement Courses:** Skill Enhancement Courses will be value-based or skill-based and there will be a pool of courses on offer. A student enrolled in an undergraduate degree programme with Honours will have to take up a minimum of two SEC courses of 4 credits each as part of the programme requirement. For students enrolled in non-Honours undergraduate degree programmes the credit requirement from Skill Enhancement Courses will be 16 credits. It is desirable that the university will prepare Skill Enhancement Courses for various disciplines from the list of SEC provided by the UGC template. However, colleges are free to develop their own SECs independently which must have prior approval of the Academic Council.

The Four-Year Undergraduate Programme (FYUGP) under Bhattadev University

<u>Guidelines of FYUGP</u>

1. Introduction

The Four-Year Undergraduate Programme (FYUGP) under Bhattadev University is based on the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020. The policy recognizes that education plays a primary role in moulding and shaping the destiny of the nation. The policy endeavors to develop India in accordance with the values enshrined in our Constitution- a democratic, just, socially conscious, cultured and humane nation upholding liberty, equality, fraternity and justice for all. The new policy therefore attempts to synthesize and harmonize the knowledge of ancient India and the emerging knowledge of the different fields so that the education system produces world leaders in all fields of human endeavour.

The system wants to do away with rote learning and encourage critical thinking, logical decision making and innovation. It want store establish India on ceagainas world or global teacher (vishwaguru) across

all field so knowledge easit once was in the ancient time. The FYUGP is designed to fulfill the diverse academic needs of the student and seeks to offer option so faulty plenaries/exits and obtain Certificate or a Diploma or Degree with Major or a Degree (Honours) or a Degree (Honours) with Research at various levels as stipulated under the policy.

1.1 Objectives

- 1. The primary object of this Regulation is to identify and foster he unique qualities of each learner and to promote a holistic development of the learner.
- 2. It also attempts to provide the learners with the opportunity to choose their learning programmes and progress in life according to their interests or talents.
- 3. The policy attempts to provide interdisciplinary and holistic education drawing from different subjects and disciplines for a new emerging world of interdependence between different disciplines.
- 4. The policy emphases on conceptual understanding, critical thinking and innovations.
- 5. The policy upholds human ethics and constitutional value so four country and emphasizes on building life skills like the team work, leadership and communications.
- 6. The policy emphasizes on the use of technology in teaching and learning and removes all kinds of language learning barriers.
- 7. The policy endeavor stone sure respect for the hetero generous culture of India and promote local language and knowledge through the various stages in the curriculum.
- 8. The policy emphasizes on equity and inclusion in matters of all educational decisions so that all students can thrive in that environment.
- 9. The under lying policy is to ensure at the education system is rooted in the values of Indian civilization and its rich, diverse, ancient and modern culture, language, knowledge system and traditions.

1.2 Curricular goals

The curricular and credit framework of FYUGP under NEP 2020 seeks to ensure the following for the students:

- ❖ Flexibility to move from one discipline of study to another
- Opportunity for learners to choose the courses of their interest in all disciplines
- ❖ Facilitating multiple entry and exit options with UG certificate or UG diploma or degree depending upon the number of credits secured
- Flexibility for learners to move from one institution to another to enable them to have multi and/or interdisciplinary learning
- Flexibility to switch to alternative modes of learning (online, ODL, and Online learning, and hybrid modes of learning).

3. Admission

Eligibility for admission into FYUGP in

- ❖ A student who has passed 12th standard or equivalent examination in any stream from recognized institution.
- Admission to the FYUGP will be based on the preference on the disciplines to be chosen as Major and Minor. At the end of 2nd Semester, student may request to alter the major and minor, subject to the availability of seats and marks obtained in the 1st year.
- Admission to a Programme or Major will be subject to availability of the subject and capacity of a department and also on the criteria set by the concerned departments.
- No student shall be eligible for admission to a Programme in any discipline under the FYUGP unless she/he fulfills the pre-requisites of courses as fixed by the university.

3.2 Reservation

Statutory reservation policy of the Government of Assam shall be followed in case of selection of eligible candidates for admission.

4. Programme and curricular

4.1 Over view and structure

The complete FYUGP consists of 8 semesters, to be completed in a minimum of 4 academic years. Each academic year has two semesters. Each semester has a minimum credit al location of 20. All together the minimum credit requirements for a 3-year programme is 120 and for a 4-year programme, its 160. The minimum credit requirements for BU's FYUGP are as follows:

*For Exit after 1st or 2nd year, students have to complete a mandatory vocational course of credit 4 during the summer vacation.

Curricular Components

The entire FYUGP curriculum is divided into two parts – (a) Core Courses and (b) Common Courses, which are described below.

Core courses

The core courses constitute Majors and Minors. A student will choose one Major subject and a Minor subject. Different options are described in the next section. All core courses have a credit allocation of 4. Altogether, irrespective of any Major or Minor options, a student will necessarily need to study 21 courses with total credit allocation of 84 over a 3- year programme. In four year programme, minimum credit for major is 80 and minor is 32.

Major Course

The minimum credit requirements for a Major Course overa3-year period are 60 accumulated from 15 Courses and 80 credits for 4 years UG programme from 20 Courses.

Minor Course

The minimum credit requirements for a Minor Course over a 3-year period for 24 accumulated from 6 papers and 32 credits for 4 years UG programme from 8 Courses.

Double Major Course

Provided a student has a Major Course with 60 credits, s/he can convert his/her Minor Course to a Double Major only with a credit allocation of 48 for 3 years and 64 for 4 years.

4.4.2 Common courses

As per the NEP guidelines, the following courses will have to be studied by all students of FYUGP:

(a) Value Addition Courses (VAC): The VAC courses will come from four sub groups—(i) Understanding India, (ii) Environmental Science, (iii) Digital and Technological Solutions, and (iv) Health & Wellness, Yoga Education, Sports, and Fitness. All together they will have a credit allocation of 8.

Each student will have to take any two courses, each of 4-credits, from any four groups during Semesters 1 & 2. Here one course from the Environmental Science group is compulsory except if the student takes a core course on Environmental Science.

(b) Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC): It includes Modern Indian Languages (MIL) and English Usage (Communication) and AEC is divided into four Courses each of credit 2 from semester I to IV.

Each student needs to complete four courses of 2 credits each—two from English Usage and other two from the group of MIL, especially designed for this purpose. These courses have to be taken during Semesters 1–4.

- (c) Inter disciplinary Courses: These are 3 credit courses spanning over five different groups of subjects (i)Natural and Physics Science, (ii) Mathematics, Statistics, and Computer Applications, (iii) Library, Information and Media Sciences,(iv) Commerce and Management and (v)Humanities and Social Sciences. The level of the recourses is of 0 99. Each student needs to take up any three courses; each with 3-creditsfromthese five sub-groups during Semesters I–III and these courses should not be studied at higher secondary level.
- (d) Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC): These are various skill courses with total credit allocation of 9. In our structure, we shall have 3 (three) skill courses starting from Semesters I–III.
- **(e) Internship:** All students are to carry out an Internship with accredit allocation of 4. The internship can be carried out within six semesters. As internships are meant to be done during semester breaks, they will not interfere with other classes.

Anti-raggingmeasures:

B. H. B. College, Sarupeta strictly follows the guidelines prescribed by the "UGC Regulations for Curbing the Menace of Ragging in the Higher Educational Institutions, 2009" and its subsequent amendments. According to the UGC Regulations and its 3rd Amendment in 2016, Ragging constitutes one or more of the following acts:

- (a) any conduct by any student or students whether by words spoken or written or by any act which has the effect of teasing, treating or handling with rudeness a fresher or any other student;
- (b) indulging in rowdy or undisciplined activities by any student or students which causes or is likely to cause annoyance, hardship, physical or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof in any fresher or any other student;
- (c) asking any student to do any act which such student will not in the ordinary course do and which hasthe effect of causing or generating a sense of shame, or torment or embarrassment so as to adversely affect the physic or psyche or such fresher or any other student;
- (d) any act by the senior student that prevents, disrupts and disturbs the regular academic activity of any other student or a fresher;
- (e) exploiting the services of a fresher or any other student for completing the academic tasks assigned to an individual or a group of students;
- (f) any act of financial extortion or forceful expenditure burden put on a fresher or any other student by students;
- (g) any act of physical abuse including all variants of it: sexual abuse, homosexual assaults, stripping, forcing obscene and lewd acts, gestures, causing bodily harm or any other danger to health or person;
- (h) any act of abuse by spoken words, emails, post, public insult which would also include deriving perverted pleasure, vicarious or sadistic thrill from actively or passively participating in the discomfiture to fresher or any other student;
- (i) any act that affects the mental health and self-confidence of a fresher or any other student with or without the intent to derive a sadistic pleasure or showing off power, authority or superiority by a student over any fresher or any other student.
- (j) Any act of physical or mental abuse (including bullying and exclusion) targeted at another student (fresher or otherwise) on the ground of colour, race, religion, caste, ethnicity, gender (including transgender), sexual orientation, appearance, nationality, regional origins, linguistic identity, place of birth, place of residence or economic background.
